

About ACS



The Pure <u>contact person</u> of your department needs to affiliate you to one or two ACS research programs¹ in Pure. ¹ Besides the departmental affiliation, all researchers must also be affiliated with at least one research institute and one research program. You can be affiliated with maximum two research institutes and maximum two research programs per research institute.

Priorities

In this situation, please mention in the 'acknowledgements' section of your publication that your research was embedded within Amsterdam Cardiovascular Sciences (as stated above).

Information for PhD candidates

PhD afternoon

Twice a year we organize a special afternoon for all PhD candidates. It includes lunch and a discussion about an item chosen by your peers, such as how to make better figures, how to improve your statistics, how to make a good poster, etc. The PhD afternoons are mandatory for all new ACS PhD candidates in Amsterdam UMC location VUmc, but are also available for location AMC PhD candidates.

ACS PhD retreat

The ACS PhD Retreat is an annual event for all PhD candidates (starters and seniors). This two-day event will consist of inspiring keynote speakers, workshops and pitches from your peers, focusing on cardiovascular sciences, but also on inspiring stories beyond. The event is free of charge and includes hotel stay and food and drinks.

Finishing your PhD? Upload your thesis in our ACS thesis app

As of January 2020, ACS provides the PhD Thesis App for ACS PhD candidates who are graduating from Amsterdam UMC. The ACS Thesis App makes your PhD thesis more interactive, accessible and sustainable. The app is sponsored by ACS and replaces the former ACS grant for printing costs.
